We wanted to send a shorter newsletter with links to our website for more information. The most exciting event in the past year was that 7 of our students passed the primary school exam. Something only possible after they had attended school for a minimum of 5 years.

The real measure of success



Sometimes the success of our participatory approach is best illustrated with a project we don't do ourselves. Metal fences now surround all seven of Fiadanana's communal <u>water faucets</u> for over 2 years. Built with a solid concrete foundation, the fences are holding up well.

All metal fences were built and paid for by the community of <u>Fiadanana</u>, because they saw a need for it, without asking Zahana for a financial contribution. This is a prime example of a community taking ownership of and responsibility for their own resources.

Some history: In 2006, the community built their communal water system with seven communal water faucets (see website) with support from Zahana. We thought (see photo below from 2006) communal water faucets could become a green oasis in the village, beautifying everything through colorful flowers and greenery, easily watered by the runoff.

Little did we know that the cows had no appreciation for esthetics, but a great hunger for juicy fresh green 'stuff'. To keep the cattle out, the community decided to use concrete and metal, keeping their seven communal water sources safe for years to come.



Planting 15,000 trees

Zahana plans to plant 10 trees for each woman, child and man in our villages.

We will actively involve the villagers as re-foresters and



caretakers in this ambitious goal to plant some 15,000 trees over the next few years.

Drawing on our <u>gardeners</u>' years of experience growing seedlings and planting trees successfully, it is time to scale up our efforts and plant a forest. <u>More on our website</u>.

"Getting a CEPE is a very big deal for everybody, nobody in their village ever got a CEPE so far", our friend and Zahana Founder Dr. Ihanta told us on Skype. "8 of our students from our Fiadanana school took the exam. They had been preparing for weeks every day with their teacher. Seven of our students passed the exam, while from other village schools only 30% to 50% of the students were so lucky."

In Madagascar a CEPE is a Certificat d'etudes primaires élémentaires (or Certificate of Primary Studies). A nation-wide standardized test, it can be awarded after attending five years of primary education. <u>More on our website</u>.

With the help of Zahana, three of the boys from one family are now able to attend the secondary school in Bevato, a small town about a 2 hours walk from their village. More

Ducks in a basket: a micro-credit project
